Course Description:

Welcome! This is an introduction to ceramics class. We will be exploring different types ceramic making, with an emphasis on process. We will also be learning about culturally diverse artists.

Course Learning Goals/ Standards (proficiencies):

Students will not only create artwork, but also be able to present it with an explanation of the meaning and purpose of it. Students will be able to respond to works of art from culturally diverse artists and make connections to their art. There will be an understanding of how events and conditions influence the arts, and how expression is successful through thought out intentions. Students will assess their own work as well as their colleagues.

Art Fee and required texts:

Students are asked to pay a \$10 art fee for supplies, if they cannot pay there will be jobs that they can do to contribute to the class. There will be reading to complete the art history part of the course. I will supplement these.

Assignments and Assessments:

We will be using both formative and summative assessments to help learning, to provide information by students assessing themselves and each other, and to modify teaching and learning activities. Formative assessments are used to provide direction for improvement for individual students or the whole class, they do not count towards the end grade for the term. Summative assessments are about the amount of learning made in a term, they are the end grade of earned proficiencies.

Our formative assessments will be practicing skills in art making, making connections to art history and critiquing. Summative assessments might look like the completion of a project, your ability to critique yourself and colleagues, and the presentation of your work.

Proficiency Grading Policies:

I require that at least 9 of the 12 art proficiencies are completed by the end of the term. Students who's work falls under Exceptional will earn an A grade for that project. Proficient work will earn a B or C.

Class Policies and Expectations
